WRI staffs and provides logistical and technical assistance to the Coalition.








## **OUR MEMBERS**

Started in the city of Vineland in 2009, the Coalition expanded to include Bridgeton and Millville in 2013. CCPYDC brings community stakeholders together in order to reduce juvenile delinquency and prevent those already involved in the juvenile justice system from becoming involved in the adult criminal justice system.

## **ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

- Decreased juvenile arrests from 2012 to 2015 by 41%
- Unified the Stationhouse Adjustment Programs (SHA), a diversion program for first time offenders, in Bridgeton, Millville and Vineland, resulting in a 122% increase in SHAs between 2013 and 2015
- Secured 21 *new* Summer Food Service Sites, serving hundreds of additional families in Cumberland County
- Provided case management and social services to 30 at-risk youth through CCPYDC's Youth For Success Initiative
- Facilitated the designation of June as Gun Safety and Violence Awareness Month in Cumberland County
- Engaged over 185 youth in Bridgeton's and Millville's PAL Basketball Leagues
- Implemented an Anti-Shoplifting Campaign, engaging over 100 students, teachers and police officers in the city of Vineland
